The Friends of the Rossland Range (FORR) are presenting an exhibit for the next two weeks at Pro Hardware in Rossland, documenting 60 years of recreation in the Rossland Range.

Nearly 20 photographers have loaned images for the travelling exhibit that is making its way through Rossland. Following the exhibit, the images will be placed in the Rossland Historical Museum.

Prior to the Pro Hardware exhibit, the images were showcased at a FORR event at the Firehall Gallery during the

2006 Winter Carnival. The event had high attendance and proved to be quite popular.

For decades, the Rossland Range, and “Old Glory” have been used as a recreational area by tourists and locals.

In 1969, it became part of the “Nancy Greene Recreational Area”. It was decommissioned as a recreational area in 1995, due to government cutbacks.
