- There is <u>very little firewood</u> at the Chimo Cabin. You may want to pack in your own if you want to warm up or toast your cheese sandwich.

- <u>Safe off-highway parking</u> in the Rec Site – 5 lots – is very important to users. While YRB does what they can some time after the snowfalls, most clearing is by a contractor (Simms) arranged for and paid by FORR. Last year we spent nearly \$6,000.
